





Getting around the region

Here in Fairfax County an extensive network of highways, railroads and airports links residents and businesses with the D.C. metropolitan area – and the world. The area is also linked with a comprehensive regional transit system that connects our business centers to the entire region.

- Four Metrorail lines with 10 stations in Fairfax, including service to Washington Dulles International Airport and Reagan National Airport
- Two Virginia Railway Express (VRE) commuter rail lines
- Multiple Amtrak rail lines with several stations within the county
- Express and High Occupancy Toll Lanes available on the Capital Beltway (I-495) as well as Interstates 66 and 95
- Car/van pool programs
- County and regional public bus lines
- Network of commuter and recreational bike paths
